How do I get to the course?

The Crandon Park Golf Course is approximately 15 minutes from The Sonesta Beach Resort Key Biscayne. Directions to the course are provided in this pamphlet.

If you would like to meet fellow golfers to drive or cab over to the course, please meet in the Lobby of the Sonesta Beach Resort at 11:00 a.m.

Please plan to arrive at the course by 11:30, a half hour prior to the tee time.

Can I Rent Clubs?

Golf clubs can be rented at the course for \$30.00. Check at the Pro-Shop for club rentals.

What Can I Wear?

Proper golf attire is required. Shirts must have collars and shorts must be Bermuda length. Tank tops and t-shirts are not permitted. Metal spiked golf shoes strongly discouraged on the course.

What do I do Once I Arrive?

Please arrive at the course at least a half-hour before your tee time - 11:30 a.m.

Upon arrival at the course, please check-in with a tournament official for your golf cart, and to leave your handicap/average score.

Box lunches will be provided in your cart and a beverage cart will be roaming the course.

The Crandon Park Golf Course Key Biscayne, Florida

Crandon Park Golf Course is a championship 18-hole golf course located on the "island paradise" of Key Biscayne, just 10 minutes from downtown Miami. It is the only public course on the Bay. Designed in 1972 by Robert von Hagge and Bruce Devlin, and redesigned by von Hagge in 1993, the course features the world's largest tee, seven saltwater lakes, challenging sand traps, mangrove thickets, and many holes overlooking Biscayne Bay.

Since 1987, it has hosted the Senior PGA Tour, attracting players including Lee Trevino, Chi Chi Rodriguez, Don Messengale, Ray Floyd and Gary Player. The course is considered one of the most beautiful and difficult par-72 courses in the state and has been rated in the top ten courses by Golfweek, and one of America's top 75 upscale courses by Golf Digest.

From the first hole - a dog leg par 5 that requires a drive over water and mangroves - to the last - another par 5 with water on both sides of the fairway - Crandon Park Golf Course has, in many ways, become Miami-Dade's signature public golf course. Play on the Bay at Crandon Park Golf Course!

- Start out going North on OCEAN DR toward GALEN DR.
- OCFAN DR becomes GALEN DR.
- Turn RIGHT onto CRANDON BLVD and continue on RICKENBACKER CSWY (Portions toll) for approximately 3 miles.
- Make a U-TURN onto RICKENBACKER CSWY (Portions toll).
- Stay on RICKENBACKER CSWY and CRANDON BLVD (Portions toll) for approximately 1 mile.
- Make a RIGHT into the CRANDON PARK GOLF COURSE entrance.

RULES OF PLAY

The AMSA Legal Open will be played in a best ball format. The rules are as follows:

- Each Team will be a foursome. The team will submit one score for the round.
- 2. Each hole will be played in a best ball format. All team members will tee off. All four players will then play subsequent shots form the location of the best played ball.
 - No more than one club length away, no closer to the pin from the fairway.
