The goal of the **Leadership Center** is to prepare and develop leaders and management executives for public water and wastewater utilities throughout the United States, so these organizations can meet customers' current and future demands for the highest level of service, quality and efficiency.

Held at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill's Kenan-Flagler Business School, the **Leadership Center** is comprised of a 12-day residential training program, ongoing Internet coaching and peer networking help as well as a 1 1/2-day refresher course 18 months after the residential program.

The **Leadership Center** is designed for public water and wastewater utility CEOs, General Managers, Senior Managers and upper-level management.
